3 elements to the exam:

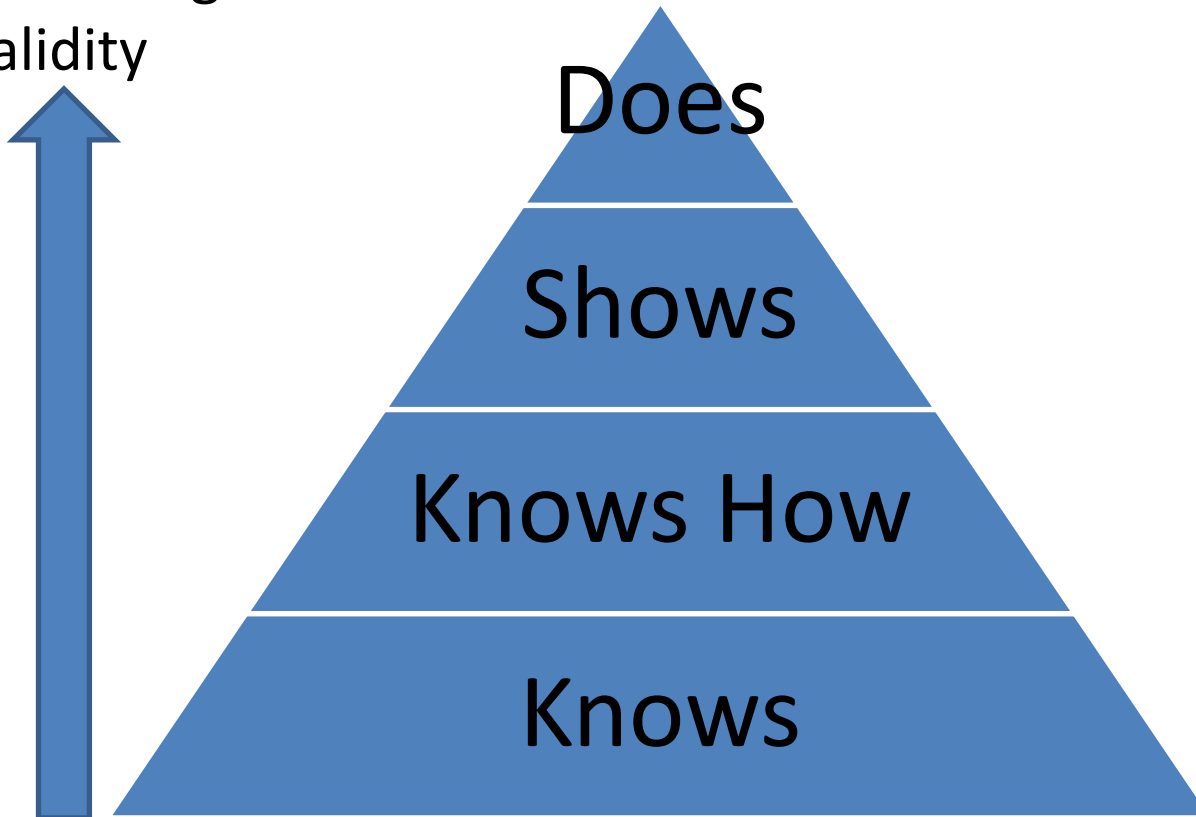
- Applied Knowledge Test – AKT

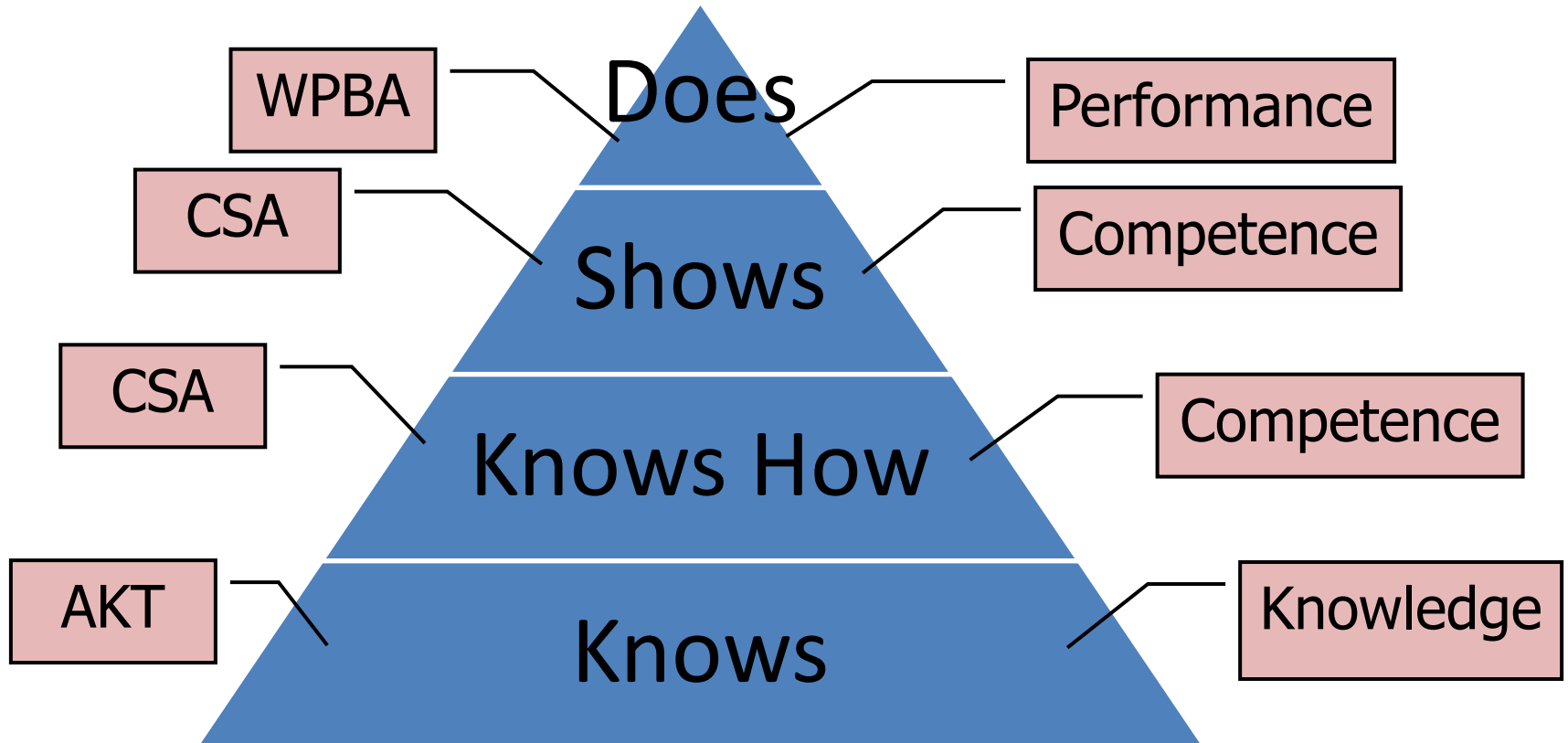

Applied Knowledge Test (AKT)

- Marked by computer
- Demonstrates knowledge
- “knows”



Clinical Skills Assessment (CSA)

- Simulated surgery
- Demonstrates competence
- “shows”



Workplace Based Assessments (WPBA)

- Done in working environment
- Demonstrates performance
- “does”

Supervisor reviews

- Clinical Supervisor's (CS) Report
 - each post in ST1 and ST2
- Educational supervisor (ES) = ST3 supervisor
- Educational Supervisor's Report (ESR)
 - 6 monthly
- **Your** responsibility to organise – make contact early

- Annual Review of Competence Progression (ARCP)
 - annual


Tips for Learning Log


- Start early
- Regular – a little and often, eg 3 entries per week
- Record things – teaching/cases/tutorials e.g. Evernote/OneNote/phone/notepad
- Write what is helpful to you – something worthwhile which you want to remember
- Keep it brief and focused
- Reflect on your *feelings* about experiences
- Write in your own style – bullet points are ok
